



The First Reading: Isaiah 25:6-10a

There is so much happening during the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Watch for these items and gestures:



The Homily



Jesus tells a story in this gospel. What does this story tell us about God? Draw or write.




The Dismissal

After the Mass has ended and you’re on your way home, look over your journal. What is one thing that you really liked that you want to remember this week? Draw or Write.




