The Psalm: 24:1BC-2, 3-4AB, 5-6

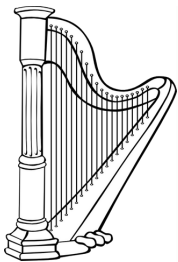
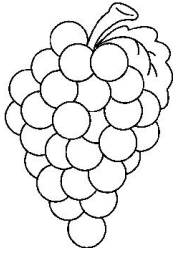
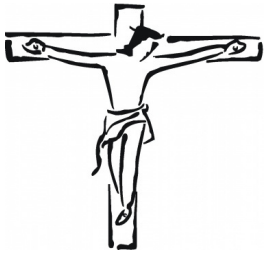
The psalmist wanted to see God's face. Jesus said anyone who sees him sees the Father. What does God look like? Draw below.
